### ITINERARY>

#### **DAY 01: BANGKOK ARRIVAL**

Arrival Bangkok International airport (Flight TBA) . Meet and collect by our representative and transfer to hotel. Rest of the day free at leisure.

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**DAY 02: BANGKOK (B)**

Breakfast at hotel

**Grand Palace & Wat Pho**

We will visit Wat Phra Kaew and the nearby attractions first, before moving on to the Grand Palace. Wat Phra Kaew, or the Temple of the Emerald Buddha, is located right next to the Grand Palace, and they probably form together the greatest spectacle for visitors in Bangkok. A visit to the Royal Grand Palace, the nation's landmark and most praised royal monument in Thailand, is a must. The palace, which is the former royal residence of the Chakri Kings, is the perfect example of an ancient Siamese court. Built in 1782 by the King Rama I, it was the centre of power for more than 150 years. Today, the palace is Bangkok's major landmark and most popular tourist attraction. Indeed, the Grand Palace is an amazing place to visit, as it consists of over 100 brightly coloured buildings, golden spires and glittering mosaics, that all date back to the foundation of Bangkok in 1782.

- i** Please note that photography is permitted in the Royal Palace Grounds and in the compounds of the Emerald Buddha Temple, but not inside the buildings



**“Wat Pho”** with its Reclining Buddha image. Wat Pho is regarded as the first centre of public education and is sometimes called ‘Thailand’s first university’. Mural paintings, inscriptions, and statues found in the temple educated people on various subjects such as literature, warfare, archaeology, astronomy, geology, meditation and is considered to be home of Thai traditional massages.

- i** Dress Code: Please note that the chapel is a national shrine and that you will be required to wear proper attire (no bare shoulders, knees or strapless-heel shoes). Shoes must be removed before entering the temple buildings as a matter of respect.

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### **DAY 03: BANGKOK (B)**

Breakfast at hotel. Enjoy half Day Klong Tour

Nineteenth-century Bangkok was laced with canals, giving the capital the designation of the 'Venice of the East'. Surviving canals as well as the Chao Phraya River itself (meaning the River of Kings) provide memorable vignettes of a traditional waterborne way-of-life that has remained essentially unchanged over the centuries. The river and canals can conveniently be explored by public transport or via a traditional long tailed boat. The tour will finally take you to Wat Arun (Temple of Dawn), this famous Chao Phraya riverbank landmark, which is best known for its porcelain encrusted 79-metre central sparkling pagoda. After a wonderful tour, we will bring you back across the river to the main starting point. Overnight in Bangkok

### **DAY 04: BANGKOK – DAMNERN – KANCHANABURI (B/L/D)**

Breakfast at hotel. Early morning pick-up from hotel in Bangkok transfer to Damnern Saduak Floating market .This interesting half-day tour will take you to the rural yet world-famous floating market of Damnern Saduak, situated around 100 kilometers west of Bangkok. It is generally known as Klong Ton Khem Floating Market or Damnern Saduak Floating Market. Damnern Saduak has officially three floating markets.

A narrow canal flanked with food stalls and souvenir shops forms the principal market.

Arrival in Kanchanaburi, Visit to the Thailand-Burma Railway Centre Museum, War Cemetery and Bridge over the River Kwai. Lunch at local restaurant (food only) and then take a long tail boat from the pier to get to River Kwai Resort, passing by unspoiled mountainous jungle scenery. Check in on arrival. Visit the



nearby ethnic Mon Tribal village. Then return to hotel. Dinner (food only), followed by a 45-minute presentation of Mon dances. Dinner at hotel (Thai Set dinner) – food only. Drinks not included. Overnight in Kanchanaburi

### **DAY 05: KANCHANABURI (B/L/D)**

Breakfast at hotel. After breakfast transfer to visit Erawan Waterfall National Park then feature with Erawan National Park where you enjoyable with Natural atmosphere Erawan Waterfall level number five is a beautifully shaded area with many little miniature falls and a gorgeous environment. Though it can get crowded, if you are able to visit before the buses of tourists arrive, you'll be able to enjoy its pure natural beauty Lunch at local restaurant return back to hotel. Dinner at Hotel (Thai Set Dinner) – food only. Drinks not included. Overnight in Kanchanaburi

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**DAY 06: KANCHANABURI – AYUTHAYA (B/L)**

Breakfast at hotel. Depart from Kanchanaburi in the morning for northern Thailand. Our first stop is at Bang Pa In, the former summer residence of the kings of Ayutthaya built in the 18th century. There we'll visit the Royal Palace, the Thai pavilion, the Chinese-style Palace Vihat Chamrun with their trimmed bushes in elephant shapes. Continue to Ayutthaya, which used to be the capital of Siam from 1350 to 1767 and visit the most interesting temples.

Lunch at local restaurant. (Drinks not included) . Overnight in Ayuthaya.

**DAY 07: AYUTHAYA - SUKHOTHAI (B/L)**

After breakfast Proceed to Sukhothai, the first capital (13th century) of the Thai Kingdom. Old Sukhothai is one of Asia's most important historical sites and therefore under the supervision of UNESCO. After a visit of the temples Wat Sra Sri and Wat Sri Chum, we continue to Sri Satchanalai, the former sister town of Sukhothai for lunch and a visit to some of its most interesting temples and ruins Lunch at local restaurant. (Drinks not included). Night in Sukhothai



**DAY 08: SUKHOTHAI – CHIANG RAI (B/L)**

Breakfast at hotel. After breakfast North Thailand is well known for its exotic hill tribes and this - morning we will visit some of their villages. The drive takes us on narrow hilly roads through beautiful landscape with spectacular views to the villages of the Akha and Yao hill tribes. Then drive to Mae Sai, which is the most northern town of Thailand on the border of Burma. Take lunch then continue to the center of the famous Golden Triangle, the meeting point of the borders of Burma, Laos and Thailand. For those who would like to come even closer to the border of Burma and Laos, an optional trip by boat on the Mekong River will be on offer. Visit to the old Opium House before continuing to the provincial town of Chiang Saen, which is located at the scenic borders of the Mekong River. Lunch at local restaurant. (Drinks not included) Return to the hotel. Overnight in Chiang Rai

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**DAY 09: CHIANG RAI – CHIANG MAI (B/D)**

Breakfast at hotel. After breakfast Drive to Mae Ka Chan, which is famous for its hot springs. Then we continue our trip through scenic hillsides and jungles to Chiang Mai, the “Rose of the North”.

Lunch at a local restaurant before arrival into Chiang Mai. Drive to Wat Phra Dhat Doi Suthep mountain temple then continue to the hotel. In the evening, a traditional Kantoke traditional dinner is on the program. Typical Thai dishes from the northern region are served while elegant Thai dancers are performing.. Overnight in Chiang Mai

**DAY 10: CHIANG MAI (B/L)**

Breakfast at hotel. In the morning we visit an elephant camp to see how elephants work and maybe take an **optional elephant ride**. Visit to the Orchid & Butterfly Farm before taking a local lunch. Visit the handicraft villages at San Kampaeng The various traditional handicrafts are fascinating to watch and there are chances to purchase the pieces also. Lunch at local restaurant. (Drinks not included) Overnight in Chiang Mai



**DAY 11: CHIANG MAI - PHUKET BY FLIGHT (B)**

Breakfast at hotel. Transfer from hotel to Chiang Mai airport for flight to Phuket (Flight TBA – Not included) arrival Phuket airport transfer to hotel. Rest time free at leisure. Overnight in Phuket

**DAY 12: PHUKET (B)**

Breakfast at hotel  
Free at leisure and Overnight in Phuket

**DAY 13: PHUKET (B)**

Breakfast at hotel  
Free at leisure and Overnight in Phuket

**DAY 14: PHUKET- DEPARTURE (B)**
