DETAILED ITINERARY

01 MARCH 2026 (SUN) (DINNER)

Day 01: Arrival Delhi

Upon arrival in Delhi, pick-up by our staff, traditional welcome and transfer to the hotel. Rest of the day at leisure. [Dinner and Night in Delhi.](#)

IMPORTANT NOTE:

- Vehicle & guide not available after checking in at hotel.
- As we do not know the exact flights, therefore, Early check in is not included on arrival. Supplements for the same given separately. (The official check-in time at the hotel is 14h)
- For similar reason, the breakfast & lunch not included on 1st March.
- Please also note, our prices are based on the group arriving at one time in same flight. In case clients have different arrivals in various flights, and need different airport transfers, an additional charge will levy. We apply the same policy for the departure.



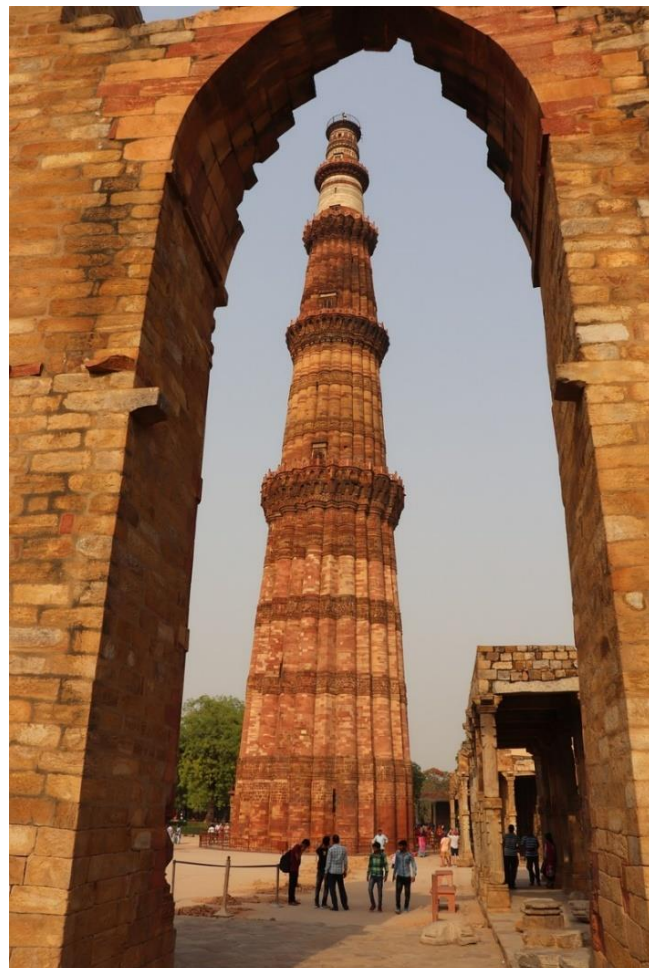
02 MARCH 2025 (MON)

Day 02: Full Day in Delhi (B + D)

Breakfast. Full day sightseeing of Delhi with a professional guide. Start the morning with a visit to Old Delhi. Built in the first half of the 17th Century by the Mughal Emperor Shah Jahan this old city is still a dense network of overcrowded homes, markets and endless alleyways dominated by the enormous **Red Fort, photo stop only** ([closed on Monday](#)). Go by **cycle rickshaw through Chandni Chowk** ([closed on a Sunday](#)) a bustling thoroughfare of shops, craftsmen's workshops, mosques, and temples. Continue onto **Jama Masjid** the largest mosque in India. **(Please wear proper dress as bare legs & shoulders will not be permitted for any gender)** We will witness the **Rajghat**, memorial to the Father of the Nation, Mahatma Gandhi. It is a simple black marble platform that marks the spot of his cremation on 31 January.

- **Optional lunch (Not included)**

Continue to visit **Humayun Tomb**, a UNESCO World Heritage site and a great place to learn about Mughal architecture. This tomb, built in 1570, is of particular cultural significance as it was the first garden-tomb on the Indian subcontinent. It inspired several major architectural innovations, culminating in the construction of the Taj Mahal. We will also visit the architectural gem **Qutub Minar**, a 72 m high brick and marble minaret built by India's first Muslim ruler, Qutub-ud-din Aibak.



In the afternoon drive through ([Only photo stop if permitted by the police](#)) the government buildings designed by British architect Sir Edwin Lutyens in a combination of western and eastern styles. Proceed up to **Rashtrapati Bhavan** once the Viceroy's abode but now the official residence of the President of India and then across to the eastern end of the Rajpath to the imposing **India Gate**. This war memorial, designed by Lutyens, commemorates the Indian soldiers who died in the First World War, on the Northwest Frontier and in the Afghan War of 1919 and, most recently, in the Indo-Pakistan war of 1971.

We will end the day with a visit to the **Gurudwara Bangla Sahib**, the Sikh temple, an architectural beauty. Gurudwara Bangla Sahib is one of the most prominent Sikh gurdwaras, or Sikh house of worship and known for its association with the eighth Sikh Guru, Guru Har Krishan Ji, as well as the holy pond inside its complex, known as the "Sarovar." It was first built as a small shrine by Sikh General Sardar Baghel Singh in 1783, who supervised the construction of nine Sikh shrines in Delhi. The grounds include the Gurudwara, a kitchen, a large (holy) pond, a school, and an art gallery. As with all Sikh Gurdwaras, the concept of langar is practiced, and all people regardless of race or religion may eat in the Gurudwara kitchen (langar hall). The Langar (food) is prepared by gursikhs who work there and also by volunteers who like to help out. Return to hotel for night stay. [Dinner and Night in Delhi](#)

03 MARCH 2025 (TUE)

Day 03: Delhi – Jaipur

(By surface, approx. 4h)

(B + D)

Breakfast at the hotel. Check out and first visit **Lotus Temple** before leaving for Jaipur. **Lotus Temple**, its completion in 1986 as a Bahá'í House of Worship, and has become one of the most visited religious buildings in the world. The temple is made of pure white marble, and the striking design represents a lotus flower; a symbol that has significance in the Hindu, Buddhist, Jainist and Islamic faiths.

IMPORTANT NOTE: Cameras and mobile phones are not permitted in the temples and modest dress is required.

After visit, you will be transferred by road to Jaipur, the pink city and capital of Rajasthan. This is a city where bazaars, elephants, camels, motorcycles, rickshaws and tucs-tucs coexist on the streets. It is a lively, colourful, and pink city. India is a country full of colours and contrasts, attractions that overflow, almost bursting forth in one place in Jaipur like no other.

Upon arrival in Jaipur, check in at the hotel.

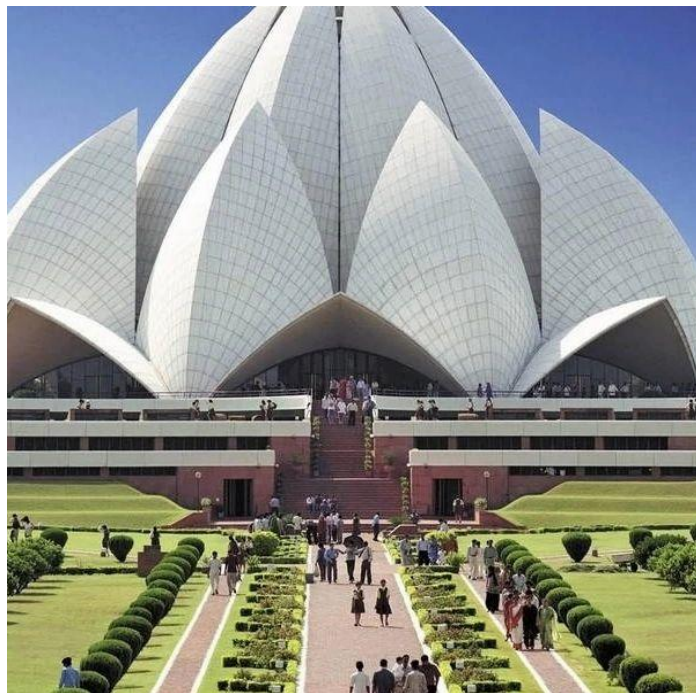
- **Lunch at your own cost. (Not Included)**

In the afternoon, we will visit the most colourful gate in India, **Patrika Gate**. It was constructed and opened to the public in 2016. Patrika Gate has been built as a unique memorial showcasing the architectural and cultural heritage of all the regions of Rajasthan. This memorial is an attempt to integrate the art, craft, and cultural heritage of Rajasthan into one structure.

In the evening, we will visit the modern part of the city, the **Birla Temple**, also known as the Laxmi Narayan temple. Dedicated to the god Vishnu (Narayan) and his consort Laxmi, the goddess of wealth. If time allows, you can witness the evening Aarti at the temple. "Aarti" refers to a devotional ritual where devotees offer lamps, incense, and flowers to the deities. It's a way of expressing reverence and seeking blessings, believed to bring spiritual fulfillment and closeness to the divine.

- **Dinner with traditional folk dance. (Included)**

In the evening, we will enjoy a dinner enlivened with typical dances at the Narayan Niwas Palace - or similar (Drinks not included) an opportunity to gain experience about the folklore of this incredible country. **Overnight in Jaipur.**

04 MARCH 2025 (WED)

Day 04: In Jaipur

(B+L+D)

TODAY WE WILL ENJOY THE HOLI FESTIVAL IN JAIPUR.

! Important Note: In the morning, we will celebrate the Holi festival. There will be no visits or walks through the bazaar because everything will be closed due to Holi, **hence the vehicle & guide will not be available.**

In the morning after breakfast, we will enjoy the Holy Festival at **Khasa Kothi**. You will be transfer at the Holi venue to witness and experience a vibrant and colourful event, including music, dancing, and the traditional throwing of colored powder and water. This Holi celebration will likely involve music, dance, and the throwing of colored powder and water, and will be a time for fun and festivity.

“**Holy**” is the festival of colores and one of the most important festivals in the country. They not only celebrate the change from winter to spring, but also, according to Hinduism, the victory of good over evil – and they celebrate it with a lot of colours. During this celebration, people throw colored powders, called Gulal on each other. In this way, the differences between castes, religion or origin disappear; The boundaries between different social classes, young and old, rich, and poor, are blurred. On this day, all people are equal. Cultural diversity, mutual respect, joy, as well as tolerance, are what make the Holi festival unforgettable.



Holi, the Festival of Colours begins on the night of the full moon with the arrival of spring, in the eleventh month of the Hindu calendar. This tradition is celebrated by millions of people with colours, music, and dances. During these days, India is impregnated with Gulal (colored powder) represented by green (symbolizing spring and new beginnings), blue (the colour of Krishna), red (love and fertility) and yellow (the colour of turmeric).

NOTE ON HOLI DRESS.

1. **Important note.** We advise you to cover and protect your camera/video from the colored powders/Gulal and water during Holi because people throw colored water and dry colour powder at each other. For any damage, we do not take any responsibility.
2. **Important note.** Gulal, colored powder is not dangerous for skin. Gulal is made from medicinal plants or colored flowers from typical trees of the area, so its manufacture was natural and homemade. **However, we are not responsible for allergies or if someone has sensitive skin.**

After the celebration, we return to the hotel for lunch. Rest of the day free.

- Dinner & overnight in Jaipur.

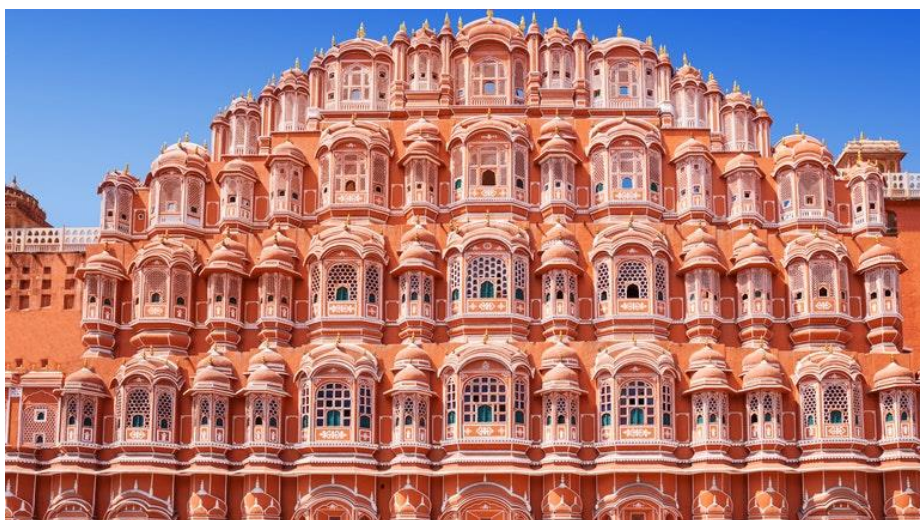
05 MARCH 2025 (THU)

Day 05: In Jaipur (B+D)

! Enjoy a yoga class before breakfast which is focusing on relax of mind and body.

After breakfast. we will start the day taking photos of an incomparable work of art, the famous **Palace of the Winds**. It has a majestic pink and white façade; the ladies of the palace, for whom it was built, could observe the exterior without being seen through its numerous viewing points filled with almost a thousand windows and lattices.

Next, we will approach the **Amber Fort**, one of the greatest jewels of all Rajasthan, with a succession of walls, access doors and palaces that rise on a rocky hill located next to a lake. Climb to the Amber Fort by Jeep.

Next, we will pass by a beautifully restored Jal Mahal palace, a former royal pavilion.

- Lunch at your own cost. (Not Included)

The **Jantar Mantar**, in Jaipur, is an astronomical observation site built in the early 18th century. It includes a set of some 20 main fixed instruments. The instruments are examples of masonry, with characteristics of their own.



A continuation, we will visit the **City Palace**, or Maharaja's Palace, which is an immense complex with numerous courtyards surrounded by various buildings, considered one of the most extraordinary palaces in all of India. It covers almost a seventh of the area of the city, built between 1729 and 1732 by order of Sawai Jai Singh II, the Palace has been the residence of the rulers of Jaipur since its construction and even today much of its buildings are occupied by the family of the current maharaja. In 1959 the royal family decided to open some areas to the public.

We will explore by foot the '**exotic bazaars**' of Jaipur, to discover the artistic wealth of the region. Visit 'Bapu Bazar' (for textiles), and 'Johari Bazar' (for jewellery). We will walk through the markets of fruits, vegetables, spices and visit small temples and interact with the local people. Return to hotel for night stay. Dinner and overnight in Jaipur.

06 MARCH 2025 (FRI)

Day 06: Jaipur- Abhaneri – Agra

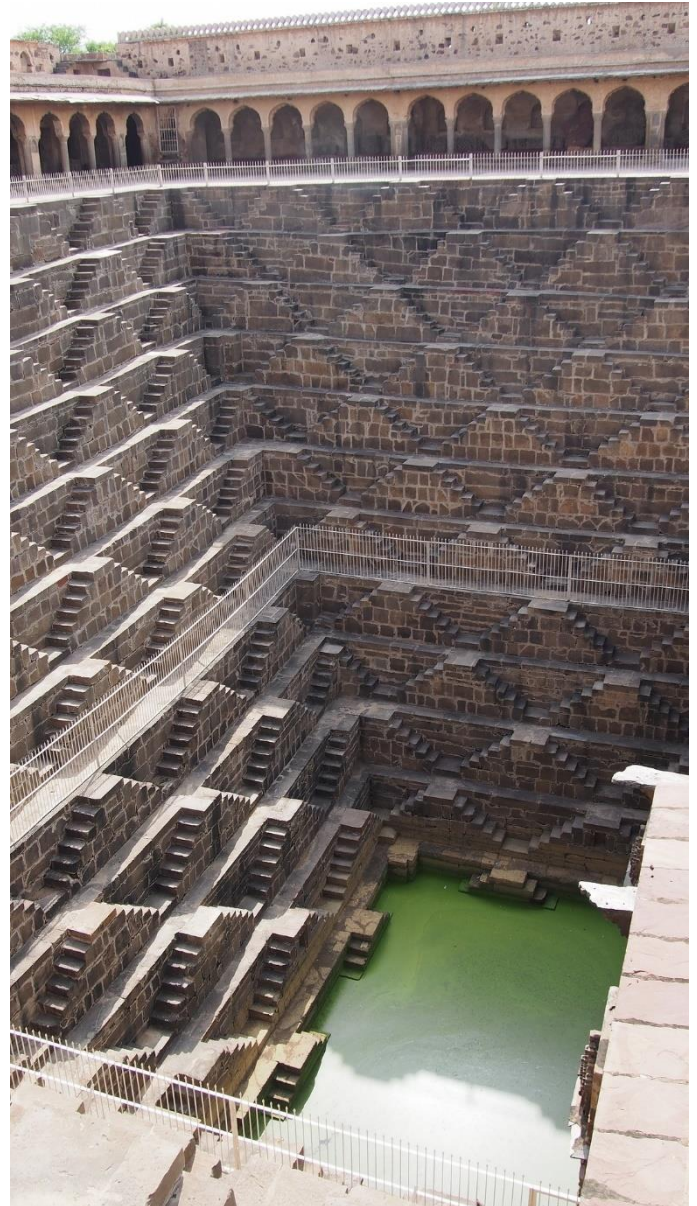
(B+D)

Breakfast at the hotel. You will be transferred by road to Agra, the home to the **Taj Mahal**. It was once the capital of the Mughal empire, and today it seems a piece of history. The Mughal emperors, with their passion for architecture, built some of the most impressive buildings in the world.

On the way, we will visit **Abhaneri stepwell**, one of the finest creations of antiquity for rainwater harvesting, a masterpiece of construction. Abhaneri is a small village and certainly worth the visit due to its Baori or step wells, that are built into the sides of the well and lead down to the water, Chand Baori has 3,500 steps that descend in perfect symmetry over thirteen storeys (20 metres). It was the ritual to wash in the step well before visiting the adjacent temple of Harshat Mata; a cheerful goddess who would reward your efforts by imparting joy and happiness. The temple still boasts examples of ancient Indian architecture and sculpture.

- Lunch on the way at your own cost. (Not Included)

Note > If you wish to have lunch, we suggest lunch at Laxmi Vilas Palace (<https://laxmivilas.com>) in Bharatpur. **(MUST RESERVE IN ADVANCE)** A great place to have lunch before arriving in Agra. It's a beautiful palace, where you can breathe peace and tranquillity, and your spirit is stirred by such beauty.



On arrival check in at hotel. In the afternoon we will explore the **Mehtab Bagh Garden** and enjoy the best views of the Taj Mahal from the other side of the river. The Mehtab Bagh Garden was built by Emperor Babur in 1530 along the Yamuna opposite the Taj Mahal and the Agra Fort. It is also noted that Emperor Shah Jahan had identified a site from the crescent-shaped, grass-covered floodplain across the Yamuna River as an ideal location for viewing the Taj Mahal. It was then created as "a moonlit pleasure garden called Mehtab Bagh." White plaster walkways, airy pavilions, pools and fountains were also created as part of the garden, with fruit trees and narcissus.

Please note, the visit of Fatehpur Sikri is not included as we lose so much of time. It takes 3 hrs appx with lot of hassle with hawkers. so, we have included viewing the Taj Mahal from Mehtab Bagh Garden which is more interesting.

Dinner with a local family. (Vegetarian Meals) - Included

Today we will have dinner at a local family's house, with a cooking demonstration. The lady of the house will give us a demonstration of the delicious Indian cuisine, which you can participate in if you wish, as well as an explanation of the different spices that are used. We will finish with a tasting of the dinner which we have prepared.

They will show us how to wear the Saree, the typical clothing of women in India, of which several curiosities await us.

After that, women who wish can get a Henna tattoo (it is temporary), an art that beautifies women of all age.

After a delicious dinner and an unforgettable experience, we returned to the hotel.

07 MARCH 2025 (SAT)

Day 07: En Agra (B+D)

Breakfast in the hotel. In the morning, we will visit the impressive **Taj Mahal (closed on Fridays)**, the Tomb of Mumtaz, beloved wife of the emperor Shah Jahan and the greatest monument to love, built by Shah Jahan as a memorial to his wife Mumtaz & a building world renowned for its power and beauty. The craftsmanship is outstanding with semi-precious stones inlaid into the marble in beautiful patterns, a process known as pietra dura, whilst the white marble reflects every change in light allowing the Taj to appear to change its hue according to the light & time of day.

Continue to the visit of **Agra Fort** on the banks of the River Yamuna which was established by the Mughal Emperor Akbar in 1565. This powerful imperial fortress dominates the centre of the city & the red sandstone walls enclose a vast area which comprises of palaces, impressive reception rooms and two very beautiful mosques.



- Optional lunch at your own cost. (Not included - direct payment)

We will end the day with a visit to the **Itmad-ud-Daula** mausoleum, the first Mughal structure built entirely of marble. Itmad-ud-Daula was the title given to Mirza Ghiyath Beg, father of Nur Jahan. He held the post of Lord of treasure of the empire and later rose to the dignity of wazir under Jahangir. Nur Jahan completed the construction of the building of the Tomb of her father in 1628 AD, 7 years after his death. Time free to explore Agra on your own.

Return to hotel for night stay. Dinner and overnight in Jaipur.

08 MARCH 2025 (SUN)

Day 08: Train to Varanasi (06:00h/13h) (B+D)

Breakfast in the train. Early morning transfer to the train station for Varanasi, "The City of a Thousand Auroras." Varanasi, also known as Kashi or Benaras, is a revered city in India, considered one of the oldest continuously inhabited cities in the world. Situated on the banks of the Ganges River, it holds immense religious significance, particularly for Hindus, and is a major pilgrimage destination. Varanasi is known for its numerous temples, ghats (stairways leading to the river), and a rich cultural heritage. Upon arrival at around 13h, meet and transfer to the hotel. Free time to relax.

- **Optional lunch at your own cost. (Not included - direct payment)**

In the evening, we will enjoy a **boat ride** with classical music on board and attend an Aarti ceremony on the banks of the Ganges River, where we will participate in the pujas (offerings), chants, and the spirituality, as well as the kindness of its people. We will take a boat ride accompanied by classical Indian music. The Ganges is one of Shiva's manifestations on earth; it is the very body of Shiva that lovingly opens itself to those faithful who seek refuge in its bosom, purifying them and guiding them toward Infinity. Every traditional Hindu long to die and be cremated in Varanasi, so that their ashes can be scattered into the Ganges.

Important Note Re Boat – Rowing boats are not available any more in Varanasi. However, being a country with contradictions and contrasts you might see rowing boats but do not get confused as they can be for VVIPs or have taken special permission. **Most of the boats now run by diesel motor, so please bear with the smoke & engine noise. However, we can try a CNG (Compressed Natural Gas) motorboat but cannot guarantee you as this is not in our control. Please take this point into consideration. So, if you are allergic to smoke and engine noise disturbs you, please do not take the boat. Please let us know in advance.**



Enjoy Thali dinner at a local restaurant (vegetarian) – Included

- ! Thali is a traditional Indian meal that offers a taste of Indian cuisine, as interesting as it is different. A Varanasi thali is a traditional Indian meal consisting of a variety of dishes served together on a large plate or tray. It typically includes a mix of regional specialties, curries, vegetables, rice, bread, and desserts, offering a taste of Varanasi's diverse culinary scene. The thali concept allows diners to sample multiple dishes in one sitting, providing a satisfying and flavorful experience.
- ! Being a holy city only vegetarian food is available only and alcohol will not be served.
- ! After a delicious dinner, we will return to the hotel for a night stay.

09 MARCH 2025 (MON)

Day 09: Fly to Delhi (B+D)

We will wake up very early to watch the sunrise over the waters of the Ganges, see the baths in the Ghats, the purifications, chants, and prayers, and perhaps even witness a cremation ceremony. **Only men will be allowed to attend, as women are prohibited from attending.**

After the boat ride, we will head back to the hotel for breakfast. Later, we'll visit the Bharat Mata Temple, also known as the Temple of Mother India, built in 1918. Its main attraction is a huge sculpted white marble map.

We can visit the Vishwanath Temple, a temple dedicated to Shiva, the official god of this city. It is also known as the Golden Temple for its three domes built of this material. It is also a pilgrimage site for many Hindus for the Aarti or pujas performed there.

We will enjoy a panoramic visit of Banaras Hindu University (BHU), which features historical buildings with beautiful carvings, wide tree-lined streets, and a serene environment.

- Optional lunch at your own cost. (Not included - direct payment)

In the afternoon, **check out and take your luggage with you.** we will visit Sarnath, where Buddha came to preach his message after attaining enlightenment in Bodhgaya. Here he gave his first sermon.

At the scheduled time, you will be transferred to Varanasi airport to fly to Delhi. Upon arrival, transfer to your hotel near the airport. **Dinner and overnight at hotel.**



10 MARCH 2025 (TUE)

Day 09: Final Departure (B)

At the scheduled time, transfer to the international airport for final departure for next destinations / home. **Note > For economy class, please arrive at the airport approximately 3 hours before your flight's departure.**
