## DETAILED ITINERARY

**18 MARCH 2027 (THU)**

**Day 01: Arrival Delhi (DINNER)**

Upon arrival in Delhi, you will be met by our representative, receive a traditional Indian welcome, and be transferred to your hotel. The remainder of the day is at leisure to relax after your journey. **Dinner and overnight stay in Delhi.**

### **Importante Notes:**

- Vehicle and guide services are not available after check-in at the hotel.
- Early check-in on arrival is not included. A supplement for early check-in is available upon request. (The hotel 's oficial check-in time is 14:00 hrs.)
- As the group arrives before the standard check-in time, breakfast and lunch on **1 March** are not included.
- Our rates are based on the entire group arriving together on the same flight. If guests arrive on different flights and require separate airport transfers, additional charges will apply. The same policy applies to departure transfers.



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**19 MARCH 2027 (FRI)**

**Day 02: Full Day in Delhi (B + D)**

**Breakfast.** Enjoy a full-day guided sightseeing tour of Delhi with a professional English-speaking guide. Begin your morning by exploring **Old Delhi**, the historic walled city built by the Mughal Emperor Shah Jahan in the first half of the 17th century. Today, it remains a vibrant maze of bustling markets, narrow lanes, traditional homes, and centuries-old architecture, dominated by the magnificent **Red Fort (photo stop only; closed on Mondays).**

Experience the charm of **Old Delhi** with a traditional cycle rickshaw ride through the lively **Chandni Chowk** market, passing bustling shops, artisans' workshops, mosques, and temples, before arriving at **Jama Masjid**, the largest mosque in India. (Please dress modestly, as bare shoulders and knees are not permitted for visitors of any gender.) **(Please note: Chandni Chowk market is closed on Sundays.)**

Continuing to **Raj Ghat**, the memorial dedicated to the Father of the Nation, Mahatma Gandhi. This serene site features a simple black marble platform marking the spot where Gandhi was cremated on 31 January 1948.

- **Optional lunch (not included).**



Continue to **Humayun's Tomb**, a UNESCO World Heritage Site and one of the finest examples of early Mughal architecture. Built in 1570, it was the first garden-tomb on the Indian subcontinent and marked a significant milestone in Mughal architectural design, inspiring later masterpieces, including the iconic Taj Mahal.

Next, visit the magnificent **Qutub Minar**, another UNESCO World Heritage Site. Standing 72 metres tall, this striking brick and marble minaret was commissioned by Qutub-ud-din Aibak, the first Muslim ruler of Delhi, and remains one of the city's most celebrated landmarks.

In the afternoon, enjoy a drive through **Lutyens' Delhi**, passing the grand government buildings designed by the renowned British architect Sir Edwin Lutyens, whose distinctive style blends classical Western and Indian architectural elements. Subject to police regulations, there will be photo stops at **Rashtrapati Bhavan**, once the residence of the British Viceroy and now the official residence of the President of India, and **India Gate**, the city's iconic war memorial. Designed by Lutyens, India Gate honours the Indian soldiers who lost their lives during the First World War, the Third Anglo-Afghan War of 1919, and later conflicts, including the Indo-Pakistani War of 1971.

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Conclude the day's sightseeing with a visit to **Gurudwara Bangla Sahib**, one of Delhi's most revered Sikh places of worship. Renowned for its beautiful golden dome and tranquil atmosphere, the gurdwara is closely associated with the eighth Sikh Guru, Guru Har Krishan Ji. The complex includes the sacred **Sarovar** (holy pond), a community kitchen (*Langar*), a school, and an art gallery. In keeping with Sikh tradition, the Langar welcomes people of all faiths and backgrounds, offering free vegetarian meals prepared by both dedicated volunteers and members of the Sikh community. Return to the hotel.  
**Dinner and overnight stay in Delhi.**

**20 MARCH 2027 (SAT)**

**Day 03: Delhi – Jaipur (By surface, approx. 4h) (B + D)**

**Breakfast at the hotel.** Check out and begin your journey with a visit to the iconic **Lotus Temple**, a Bahá'í House of Worship completed in 1986. Renowned for its striking lotus-inspired architecture clad in pristine white marble, it is one of the most visited religious buildings in the world. The lotus design symbolizes purity and unity, holding significance in the Hindu, Buddhist, Jain, and Islamic traditions.

**Important Note:** Cameras and mobile phones are not permitted inside the temple, and visitors are requested to dress modestly.



After the visit, depart by road for **Jaipur**, the vibrant capital of Rajasthan, affectionately known as the "Pink City." A fascinating blend of tradition and modernity, Jaipur's bustling streets are shared by camels, elephants, motorcycles, auto-rickshaws, and colourful bazaars. Rich in history, culture, and architectural splendor, the city offers an unforgettable introduction to Rajasthan. Upon arrival, check in at your hotel.

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- **Optional lunch** (not included).

In the afternoon, visit the spectacular **Patrika Gate**, one of Jaipur's most photographed landmarks. Opened in 2016, this magnificent gateway celebrates the rich artistic, architectural, and cultural heritage of Rajasthan. Every arch and corridor is adorned with intricate paintings and vibrant motifs representing the state's diverse regions, making it a favorite spot for photography.



Later, visit the beautiful **Birla Temple** (Laxmi Narayan Temple), located in the modern part of the city. Dedicated to Lord Vishnu (Narayan) and Goddess Lakshmi, the temple is renowned for its elegant white marble architecture and peaceful atmosphere. If time permits, witness the evening **Aarti**, a traditional Hindu prayer ceremony during which lamps, incense, flowers, and devotional chants are offered to the deities, creating a truly spiritual and memorable experience.



- **Dinner with traditional folk dance** (included) in Jaipur.

This evening, enjoy a traditional Rajasthani dinner accompanied by colourful folk music and dance performances at **Narain Niwas Palace** or a similar heritage venue. (Beverages are not included.) This delightful cultural evening offers a wonderful opportunity to experience Rajasthan's vibrant traditions and warm hospitality. **Overnight stay in Jaipur.**

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**21 MARCH 2027 (SUN)**  
**Day 04: In Jaipur (B + D)**

**! Enjoy a relaxing yoga class before breakfast, helping to calm the mind and rejuvenate the body.**



After breakfast, we will begin the day with a photo stop at one of Jaipur's most iconic landmarks: the magnificent **Palace of the Winds**. Renowned for its striking pink-and-white façade, this architectural masterpiece was built so that the ladies of the royal household could observe life outside without being seen. Its intricate façade features nearly a thousand windows and delicate lattice screens, creating one of the city's most recognizable sights. **This will be a Photo stop only.**

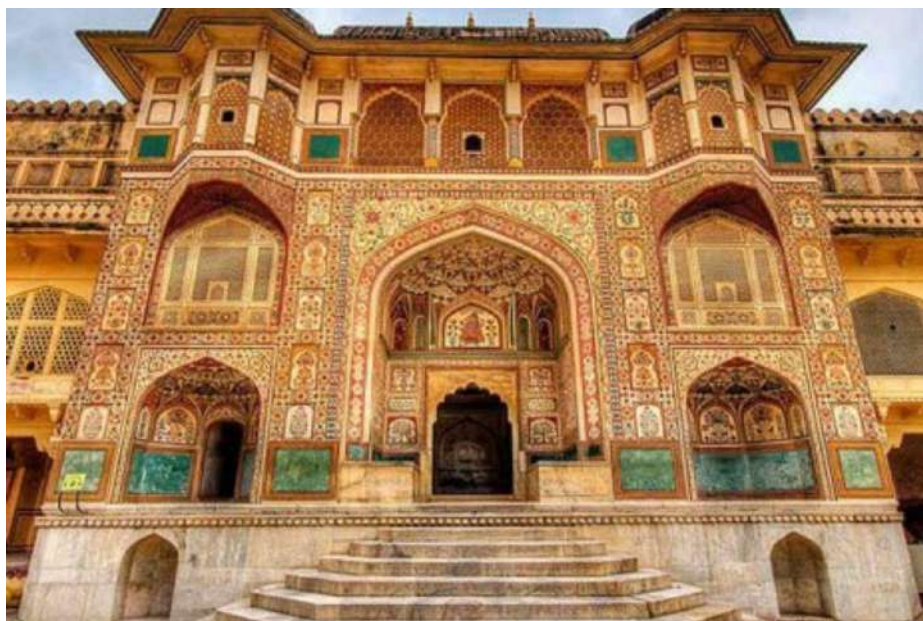


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Next, we make our way to the magnificent **Amber Fort**, one of Rajasthan's most spectacular treasures. Perched majestically on a rocky hillside overlooking a tranquil lake, this UNESCO World Heritage Site is a breathtaking blend of imposing ramparts, grand gateways and exquisite palaces, offering a fascinating glimpse into the splendor of Rajasthan's royal past. To enhance your experience, you will ascend to the fort by Jeep, enjoying wonderful views as you make your way to this remarkable fortress.

**PLEASE NOTE: Elephant rides are not included.** As part of our commitment to responsible and ethical tourism, we do not include elephant rides to or from Amber Fort. However, should you still wish to experience an elephant ride, please let us know well in advance so that we can arrange it on request (subject to availability). As the number of elephants permitted each day is limited, last-minute bookings cannot be guaranteed. Our journey continues with a drive past the picturesque **Jal Mahal** (Water Palace), a beautifully restored royal pavilion that appears to float serenely in the middle of Man Sagar Lake, providing one of Jaipur's most iconic photographic views.

- **Lunch at your leisure** (not included).

This afternoon, we visit the remarkable **Jantar Mantar**, an 18th-century astronomical observatory and UNESCO World Heritage Site, home to a fascinating collection of remarkably accurate astronomical instruments. We then explore the magnificent **City Palace**, one of India's finest royal residences. With its elegant courtyards, museums and beautifully decorated halls, it offers a fascinating insight into Jaipur's royal heritage and remains home to the city's royal family.

Later, enjoy a guided walk through Jaipur's vibrant bazaars, including **Bapu Bazaar**, famous for its textiles and handicrafts, and **Johari Bazaar**, renowned for its jewellery and gemstones. Along the way, soak up the colourful atmosphere, browse local markets and experience the authentic charm of the Pink City. Return to the hotel. **Dinner and overnight stay in Jaipur.**

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**22 MARCH 2027 (MON)**

**Day 05: In Jaipur (B+L+D)**

## **Today, we celebrate the vibrant festival of Holi in Jaipur.**

**Important Note:** As Holi is one of India's most important national festivals, the city's markets, monuments and many businesses will remain closed throughout the day. Consequently, no sightseeing or bazaar visits are scheduled, and the guide and vehicle will not be available during the festival celebrations.

After breakfast, you will be transferred to Khasa Kothi, where you will take part in an authentic Holi celebration. Immerse yourself in one of India's most joyful and colourful festivals, enjoying lively music, traditional dancing, and the unforgettable experience of throwing vibrant coloured powders and water in a festive atmosphere.



**Holi**, often referred to as the Festival of Colours, marks the arrival of spring and is one of the most cherished celebrations in India. According to Hindu tradition, it symbolises the triumph of good over evil and the renewal of life.

During the festivities, family, friends and strangers alike come together to throw brightly coloured powders, known as *Gulal*, over one another. For one special day, social barriers disappear as people celebrate together regardless of age, caste, religion or social background. It is a unique occasion that embodies friendship, equality, happiness and togetherness.

Experiencing Holi is far more than witnessing a festival—it is an opportunity to become part of one of India's most treasured cultural traditions, creating memories that will last a lifetime.

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**Holi**, the famous Festival of Colours, celebrates the arrival of spring and the triumph of good over evil. It is one of India's most joyful and vibrant festivals, bringing millions of people together through music, dancing and the playful throwing of brightly coloured powders (*gulal*). Each colour has its own symbolic meaning: green represents new beginnings, blue is associated with Lord Krishna, red symbolises love and prosperity, and yellow represents happiness and well-being. More than just a celebration, Holi is a unique expression of friendship, unity and renewal, creating an unforgettable cultural experience.



#### **Your Holi Celebration Includes:**

- Return transfers between your hotel and Khasa Kothi, the Holi celebration venue.
- Organic, skin-friendly coloured powders (*gulal*).
- Traditional white attire for the Holi festivities.
- A selection of authentic Indian snacks.
- Soft drinks and other non-alcoholic refreshments.
- Live folk music and traditional dance performances.
- One Indian beer per person, served with the meal at the hotel.

#### **IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR HOLI**

1. **Protect your belongings:** During the celebrations, coloured powders (*gulal*) and water are thrown by participants. We recommend protecting cameras, mobile phones and other valuables with waterproof covers. Anglo Indiago Travels cannot accept responsibility for any loss or damage.
2. **About the colours:** The *gulal* used is organic and generally safe for the skin. However, if you have sensitive skin or allergies, **we recommend taking appropriate precautions, as participation is at your own discretion.**

After the festivities, we return to the hotel for a well-deserved lunch. The remainder of the day is at leisure, allowing you to relax and enjoy the hotel's facilities.

- Dinner and overnight stay in Jaipur.

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**23 MARCH 2027 (TUE)**

**Day 06: Jaipur- Abhaneri – Agra (B+D)**

After breakfast at the hotel, we depart by road for **Agra**, home to the magnificent **Taj Mahal**. Once the capital of the mighty Mughal Empire, Agra is a city where history comes vividly to life. Renowned for its extraordinary architectural heritage, it was the seat of some of the empire's greatest rulers, whose vision and passion for art and architecture gave rise to some of the world's most remarkable monuments. As you journey through this historic city, you will discover the enduring legacy of the Mughal emperors, whose masterpieces continue to captivate visitors from around the globe.



En route to Agra, we visit the remarkable **Chand Baori** stepwell in the village of **Abhaneri**, one of India's most impressive examples of ancient engineering and water conservation. Built over a thousand years ago to harvest precious rainwater, this extraordinary architectural masterpiece is among the deepest and largest stepwells in the country.

The spectacular stepwell features around **3,500 perfectly symmetrical steps** descending over **13 levels** to a depth of approximately **20 metres**, creating one of the most striking geometric designs in India. In ancient times, pilgrims would descend the steps to perform ritual ablutions before visiting the neighbouring **Harshat Mata Temple**, dedicated to the Goddess of Joy and Happiness. Although partially in ruins, the temple still showcases exquisite examples of early Indian architecture and intricate stone carvings.

- **Lunch at your leisure (not included).**

**Optional lunch recommendation:** If you would like to stop for lunch, we highly recommend **Laxmi Vilas Palace** in Bharatpur (**advance reservation required**). Set within a beautifully restored heritage palace, it offers an elegant dining experience in peaceful surroundings, making it the perfect place to relax before continuing your journey to Agra.

Upon arrival in Agra, check in to your hotel.

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Later this afternoon, we visit the tranquil **Mehtab Bagh** (Moonlight Garden), one of the city's hidden gems. Situated on the opposite bank of the Yamuna River, these beautifully restored Mughal gardens offer arguably the finest panoramic views of the **Taj Mahal**, particularly as the changing light bathes the marble monument in warm afternoon hues. Originally commissioned by Emperor Babur in the 16th century and later enhanced by Emperor Shah Jahan, Mehtab Bagh was designed as a perfectly symmetrical garden from which to admire the Taj Mahal. With its elegant pathways, fountains, reflecting pools, pavilions and fragrant gardens, it remains one of the most peaceful and photogenic locations in Agra.



**Please note:** A visit to **Fatehpur Sikri** is not included in this itinerary. Although it is an impressive historical site, the excursion requires approximately three hours and often involves significant delays due to traffic and persistent hawkers.

Instead, we have chosen to include a visit to the beautiful **Mehtab Bagh** (Moonlight Garden), which offers spectacular panoramic views of the **Taj Mahal** from across the Yamuna River. This peaceful setting provides one of the finest photographic opportunities in Agra and allows you to enjoy the monument from a unique perspective in a relaxed and tranquil atmosphere, making for a far more enjoyable and memorable experience.

**This evening, enjoy a traditional vegetarian dinner with a local family**, offering a wonderful opportunity to experience genuine Indian hospitality, savour authentic home-cooked cuisine, and gain a fascinating insight into local culture and daily life. *(Included)*.

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This evening, we are welcomed into the home of a local family for a truly authentic cultural experience. Enjoy a traditional vegetarian dinner while discovering the secrets of Indian cuisine through a live cooking demonstration. Your host will introduce you to the rich flavours and aromatic spices that are the heart of Indian cooking, explaining how they are used to create a variety of delicious dishes. If you wish, you are welcome to take part in the preparation before sitting down to enjoy the freshly prepared meal together. During the evening, you will also be introduced to the elegant **saree**, India's iconic traditional garment worn by women. Your hosts will demonstrate how it is draped and share some of the fascinating traditions and cultural significance associated with this timeless attire, offering a memorable insight into Indian family life and customs.



Following the meal, ladies who wish may enjoy a traditional **henna (mehndi)** application. This beautiful, temporary body art has been an integral part of Indian culture for centuries and is often applied during festivals and special celebrations.

After a delicious home-cooked dinner and an unforgettable evening of cultural exchange, we return to the hotel for an **overnight stay in Agra.**

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**24 MARCH 2027 (WED)**

**Day 07: En Agra (B+D)**

After breakfast at the hotel, we visit the magnificent **Taj Mahal** (*closed on Fridays*), one of the world's most celebrated monuments and a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Commissioned by the Mughal Emperor **Shah Jahan** in memory of his beloved wife, **Mumtaz Mahal**, the Taj Mahal is widely regarded as the greatest monument ever built in honour of love. Completed in the 17th century, this architectural masterpiece continues to captivate visitors from around the world with its perfect symmetry, exquisite craftsmanship and timeless beauty. The mausoleum is adorned with intricate **pietra dura** inlay work, where semi-precious stones are meticulously set into pristine white marble to create delicate floral and geometric designs. As the sunlight changes throughout the day, the marble reflects the varying light, causing the monument to transform through a spectrum of subtle shades—from soft pink at dawn to brilliant white in daylight and a warm golden glow at sunset—making every visit a truly unforgettable experience.



Our sightseeing continues with a visit to the impressive **Agra Fort**, a UNESCO World Heritage Site situated on the banks of the Yamuna River. Commissioned by the Mughal Emperor **Akbar** in 1565, this magnificent red sandstone fortress served as the principal residence of the Mughal emperors for generations. Dominating the heart of Agra, its imposing walls enclose a vast complex of elegant palaces, grand audience halls, beautifully landscaped courtyards and two exquisite mosques. As you explore this remarkable fortress, you will discover the splendour of Mughal architecture and gain a fascinating insight into the lives of the emperors who once ruled one of the world's greatest empires.

From several vantage points within the fort, you can also enjoy superb views of the **Taj Mahal**, where Emperor Shah Jahan is said to have spent his final years gazing across the river towards the monument he built in memory of his beloved wife.

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- **Lunch at your leisure (not included – direct payment).**



Later, we visit the elegant **Itimad-ud-Daulah** Mausoleum, often affectionately referred to as the "Baby Taj" for its delicate beauty and exquisite craftsmanship. Built entirely from white marble, it was the first Mughal monument to be constructed entirely in this precious stone and is considered the architectural predecessor of the Taj Mahal. Commissioned by the influential Nur Jahan in memory of her father, Mirza Ghiyas Beg, who was honoured with the title *Itimad-ud-Daulah* ("Pillar of the State"), the mausoleum was completed in 1628, seven years after his death. Its intricate marble lattice screens, graceful inlay work and finely detailed decoration showcase the exceptional artistry that would later reach its pinnacle in the Taj Mahal.

Following the visit, enjoy some free time to explore Agra at your own pace, browse the local shops, or simply relax before returning to the hotel. [Dinner and overnight stay in Agra.](#)

## **25 MARCH 2027 (THU)**

### **Day 08: Train to Varanasi (06:00h/13h) (B+D)**

Breakfast will be served on board the train.

Early this morning, you will be transferred to the railway station to board your train to **Varanasi**, one of India's most sacred and spiritually significant cities. Also known as **Kashi** or **Benaras**, Varanasi is believed to be one of the oldest continuously inhabited cities in the world, with a history stretching back more than 3,000 years. Situated on the banks of the holy **River Ganges**, Varanasi is the spiritual heart of Hinduism and one of the country's most important pilgrimage destinations. Renowned for its ancient temples, sacred **ghats** (stone steps leading down to the river), vibrant rituals and rich cultural heritage, the city offers an unforgettable glimpse into India's timeless traditions and spiritual life.

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On arrival at approximately **13:00**, you will be met and transferred to your hotel. The remainder of the afternoon is at leisure, allowing you time to relax and settle in before the evening's experiences.

- **Lunch at your leisure** (not included – direct payment).



As the sun begins to set, we make our way to the banks of the sacred River Ganges to experience one of the most moving and memorable moments of your journey through India. Enjoy a scenic **boat ride** along the Ganges, accompanied by the gentle sounds of classical Indian music, as you witness the timeless life unfolding along the famous ghats of Varanasi. From the river, you will observe pilgrims performing ancient rituals, devotees offering prayers, and the city's extraordinary spiritual atmosphere.

As darkness falls, you will attend the captivating **Ganga Aarti ceremony**, a deeply symbolic Hindu ritual held each evening in honour of the sacred river. Watch as priests perform synchronised rituals with flaming oil lamps, accompanied by devotional chanting, the ringing of temple bells and the fragrance of incense. You will also have the opportunity to take part in this unforgettable experience by making your own offering (*puja*) to the Ganges.

For Hindus, the River Ganges is far more than a river—it is revered as a living goddess and a symbol of purification, compassion and eternal life. According to Hindu belief, to die and be cremated in Varanasi, with one's ashes immersed in the sacred waters of the Ganges, offers liberation from the cycle of rebirth (*moksha*). This profound spiritual significance makes Varanasi one of the world's most revered pilgrimage destinations.

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## **IMPORTANT INFORMATION – BOAT CRUISE**

- Please note that traditional rowing boats are no longer generally permitted for visitors in Varanasi. Most sightseeing boats are now powered by diesel engines, which may produce some engine noise and exhaust fumes. Where available, we will endeavour to arrange a CNG (Compressed Natural Gas) motorboat, which offers a quieter and more environmentally friendly experience; however, availability cannot be guaranteed and is beyond our control. If you are particularly sensitive to engine noise or exhaust fumes, please let us know in advance so that we can discuss the available alternatives.

**This evening, enjoy a traditional vegetarian Thali dinner at a local restaurant (included), offering a wonderful introduction to the rich flavours and culinary traditions of Varanasi.**

**A Thali** is one of India's most authentic dining experiences, served on a large round platter featuring a selection of carefully prepared dishes. Your meal will typically include regional specialities, fragrant curries, seasonal vegetables, lentils, rice, freshly baked Indian breads, pickles, chutneys and a traditional dessert. The variety of flavours, textures and aromas provides a delicious insight into the diverse cuisine of this historic city. Please note: As Varanasi is one of Hinduism's holiest cities, only vegetarian cuisine is served at the restaurant, and alcoholic beverages are not available.



A Thali is one of India's most iconic culinary experiences, offering an authentic taste of the country's rich and diverse cuisine. Served on a traditional platter, a Varanasi Thali features a selection of regional specialities, including curries, lentils, rice, fresh breads, pickles, chutneys, and a dessert—bringing together a variety of flavours in one memorable meal.

**Please note:** As Varanasi is one of the holiest cities in Hinduism, only vegetarian cuisine is served, and alcoholic beverages are not available.

After this delightful dining experience, we return to the hotel for an overnight **stay in Varanasi.**

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**26 MARCH 2027 (FRI)**

**Day 09: In Varanasi (B+D)**

Before dawn, we set out to witness the unforgettable sunrise over the sacred **River Ganges**, one of the most atmospheric and spiritual experiences in India. As the first rays of sunlight illuminate the river, observe the ancient **ghats** come to life with pilgrims performing their morning ablutions, devotees offering prayers and chanting sacred hymns, and priests carrying out centuries-old rituals.

During the boat ride, there may also be an opportunity to observe one of the traditional cremation ceremonies taking place at the riverside cremation ghats. These ceremonies are conducted with great reverence and form an important part of Hindu beliefs surrounding the cycle of life, death and liberation (moksha).

**Please note:** If a cremation ceremony is taking place during your visit, only male visitors may approach the cremation area in accordance with local customs and the wishes of the families. Female visitors are respectfully requested to remain at a distance. We kindly ask all guests to observe these ceremonies with sensitivity and respect. There is strictly **no photography** at the cremation ghats.



After our early morning boat cruise, we return to the hotel for breakfast.

Later, visit the unique **Bharat Mata Temple**, dedicated to Mother India rather than a deity. Inaugurated in 1936, it is renowned for its remarkable three-dimensional relief map of the Indian subcontinent, carved from a single block of white marble. Continue to the revered **Shri Kashi Vishwanath Temple**, one of Hinduism's holiest shrines dedicated to Lord Shiva. Famous for its magnificent gold-plated domes, this sacred Jyotirlinga attracts thousands of pilgrims who come to offer prayers and experience its deeply spiritual atmosphere. Conclude with a panoramic drive through **Banaras Hindu University (BHU)**, one of Asia's largest and most prestigious residential universities. Its impressive architecture, tree-lined avenues, and peaceful campus provide a refreshing contrast to the vibrant energy of Varanasi.

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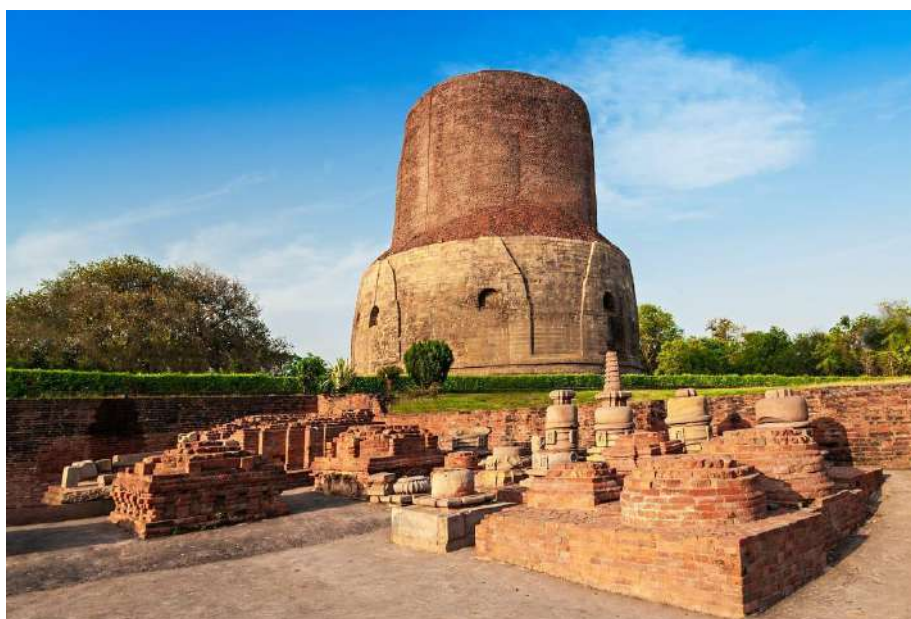
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- **Lunch at your leisure** (not included – direct payment).

This afternoon, we travel to **Sarnath**, one of the most important Buddhist pilgrimage sites in the world. It was here, after attaining enlightenment beneath the Bodhi Tree at Bodh Gaya, that **Lord Buddha** delivered his first sermon, setting in motion the teachings that would become Buddhism. 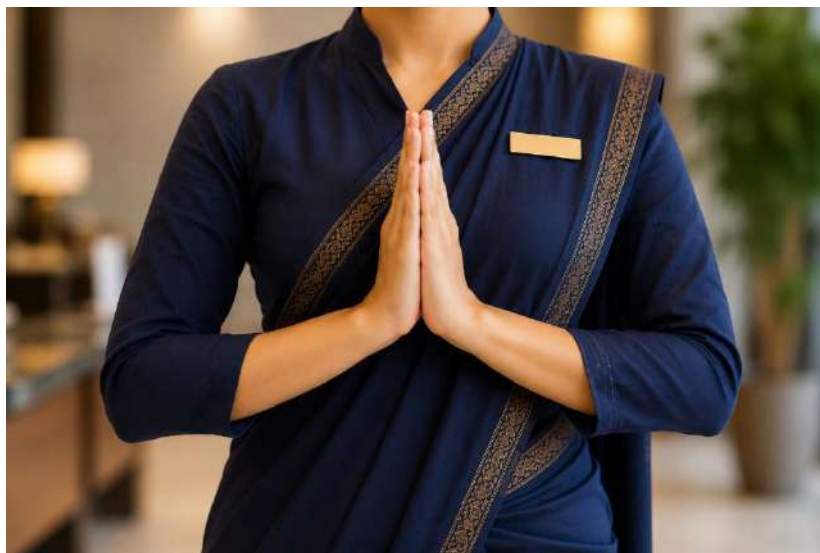
